Hurricane Emergency Preparation

The 2010 hurricane season has begun. If you are prepared, congratulations—you are in the minority! If you are not (like the most of the rest of us), please read on.

The forecasters are predicting an active season for 2010. The *El Niño* pattern that helped us last year seems to be dissipating, the Atlantic surface temperature seems to be warming, and the trade winds that help mix the deep cool water with the warm surface water are projected to be weaker this year. Looking back on the way Mother Nature treated us with record cold last winter, the earthquakes in Haiti and Chile, volcanic eruptions in Iceland and Central and South America, floods in Tennessee and recent tornados in Oklahoma, I am not optimistic that we will be so lucky again this year. If I am right, here's a **minimum FEMA Disaster Supply Kit**:



- Three day supply of drinking water—on gallon per day for each person and pet
- Three day supply of non-perishable food -don't forget a manual can opener.

- Clothing and footwear changes for each person.
- Sleeping bag or blankets for each person
- First Aid Kit and prescription medicines
- Flashlights, emergency battery powered radios, extra batteries, and emergency tools
- Spare set of car and house keys
- Cash or Travelers checks
- Special items for the elderly, disabled or infants; supplies for pets
- Important documents: insurance papers, registrations, licenses and so forth.

Hoping you will not need any of the above, the time to start assembling them is NOW! Don't forget that you have an obligation to be prepared, first for yourself and your family and then for your neighbors and others.

Summer Fun Facts from Early Learning Academy

Below are some fun summer fun facts and suggestions from our Early Learning Academy Director on having a great, fun summer with a child.

Children need to know 10,000 to 12,000 words to be successful readers. Five year olds starting school come in knowing between 4, 000 and 12,000 words. Why is there such a difference? Homes where parents model reading by reading to their child, talking to and with children, and playing games develop more language for children. Children who are read to, talked to and played with **1,800** hours (one hour a day from birth) learn about 10,000 words by age 5.

Children who are read to, talked with, and played with **2,000** hours (1.1 hour per day from birth) learn about 10,000 to 12,000 words by age 5.)

Children who are read to, talked to, and played with for **2** minutes a day learn about 4,000 words by age 5.

Listed below are some different things to do with children that do not require extensive or expensive materials. (Remember it is the process, not the product that is important.) The most important thing is to have fun!

Read books together every day

Before you begin, make a bookmark to mark your place.

Make lemonade or your favorite cold drink.

Find a comfy place to sit.

Read the story over several days.

Talk about what might happen next between readings.

Make a reading fort with an old blanket between two chairs

Don't worry about reading the same book over and over. This is a stage of reading for children.

Remember to make snuggling a part of the reading.

Be sure to include books about Jesus.



Go to the library and get "their very own" library card.

Find out about the local story hour.

Check out three new books.

Decorate a library bag for trips to and from the library.

Bake Cookies together from scratch – or the easy way.

Eat one finished product together with a glass of milk.

Paint your old white sneakers

Wash the shoes.

Buy some fabric paint or acrylic craft paint.

Cover the table with newspaper.

Paint the shoes with brushes.

Use rubber stamps and paint the acrylic paint on the stamp and decorate that way.

Make a cassette tape for the car or someone special

Make a list of your favorite songs.

Be sure to include songs about God's love.

Write the titles down (sitting together side by side.)

Practice singing the songs.

Record the tape.

Be sure to include a dedication at the beginning (Grandpa, these songs are for you).

Write a letter

Sit side-by-side and write a letter to a friend (big or little).

Draw a picture (each of you) to enclose.

Put it in an envelope.

Drive to the Post Office together.

Buy one stamp – have your child pay.

Put on the stamp and mail the letter.

Plant some seeds

Buy a bag of grass seed (or find it in the garage).

Save several egg shell halves and the carton.

Draw a face on the shells with permanent marker.

Fill with dirt and plant the grass seed

Water and watch it grow.

Give it a "haircut" together.



Make a pocket garden

Fold a white paper towel so it will fit in a small ziplock bag.

Soak some bean seeds overnight (use soup beans – they are cheaper).

Put three beans in the bag.

Water and seal.

Put it in your pocket and carry around.

Body heat helps it sprout quicker.

After it sprouts, hang it in a sunny place and watch the roots grow.

Talk about how God makes all things grow, including little children.

Sort the laundry together

Establish four piles.

Dark, light, medium and white.

Work together to sort the laundry.

Be sure to do the sock matching together after the dryer is finished.

Talk about the different colors, sizes and patterns on the socks.

Picnic in the living room

Put a blanket on the living room floor.

Pack a picnic lunch together.

Keep it simple and neat.

Put it in a picnic basket.

Eat it in the living room.


Share a story together.

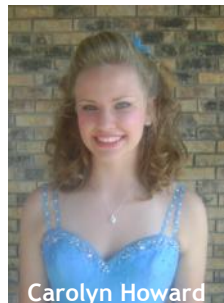

Make a terrarium
